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The Washington State Association of County Auditors have <u>a web site explaining steps people</u> need to take to ensure their vote is counted properly. Unfortunately, the auditors didn't review what the web design team came up with, because their page on <u>how to mark your ballot</u> is illustrated with a cute graphic with a check-mark. Too bad the check mark is the **wrong** way to cast your vote in every single county in Washington. For written ballots, you're supposed to fill in the square or circle completely, not use a check-mark.
