That mysterious 01

Some time ago, we learned the story of <u>that mysterious J</u>. There is another mystery character that sometimes shows up in place of a smiley face: the \setminus 001. The character starts out as the Unicode <u>U+263A</u>, which looks like this: . In code page 437, this character lives at position 1, and depending on what program is being used to display the character, it might appear as a box (representing the character U+0001) or as the escape sequence \setminus 001.

You can think of this as a version of the mysterious J, but taking a route through code page 437, or you can think of it as <u>how a bullet turns into a beep</u> taken in reverse, then reversed again.
