Why doesn't GetAddrInfo work from behind a proxy?

A customer was having a problem with the **GetAddrInfo** function when running inside a corporate proxy environment.

We are trying to get the IP address of, say, www.microsoft.com by using the **GetAddrInfo** function. This works fine if the computer is not behind a proxy, but if it is run in a corporate proxy environment, the call fails with **WSAHOST_NOT_FOUND**.

The GetAddrInfo function operates at a level below proxies. When you have a Web proxy, the computer never actually talks to www.microsoft.com directly. Instead, you connect to the proxy and tell the proxy, "Please contact www.microsoft.com for me, thanks." That's why it's called a "proxy".

You never see the IP address of www.microsoft.com; the only IP address you see is that of the proxy. Besides, since you are inside a corporate proxy environment, even if you had the IP address for www.microsoft.com, it is if no use to you since you cannot connect to it.

There are <u>products</u> that try to smooth over this boundary, so that programs think that they are connected directly to the Internet when in fact they are talking through the proxy.
